


WEEKLY NEWSLETTER Friday 1 May

HEALTH NOTICES

I received a phone call from a parent earlier today to say that an older sibling of a child at St Maddern's is currently in hospital with viral meningitis. (This is very different from the bacterial form which can be dangerous.) He is being monitored at the moment and is responding well. I have taken advice from Public Health England and they have advised me that viral meningitis is a relatively mild disease and does not spread from person to person and there is no need to be concerned.

We have received notification from Public Health England that there has been an increase in Scarlet Fever and Chicken-pox in the South West. Scarlet Fever is a common childhood bacterial infection. The symptoms of Scarlet Fever include sore throat, headache, fever, nausea and vomiting. After 12—48 hours the characteristic red, pinhead rash develops, typically appearing on the chest and stomach, then rapidly spreading to other parts of the body. Children and adults with suspected Scarlet Fever should contact their GP.
